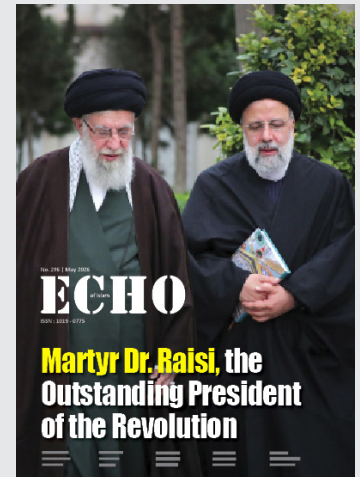

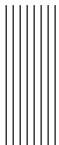

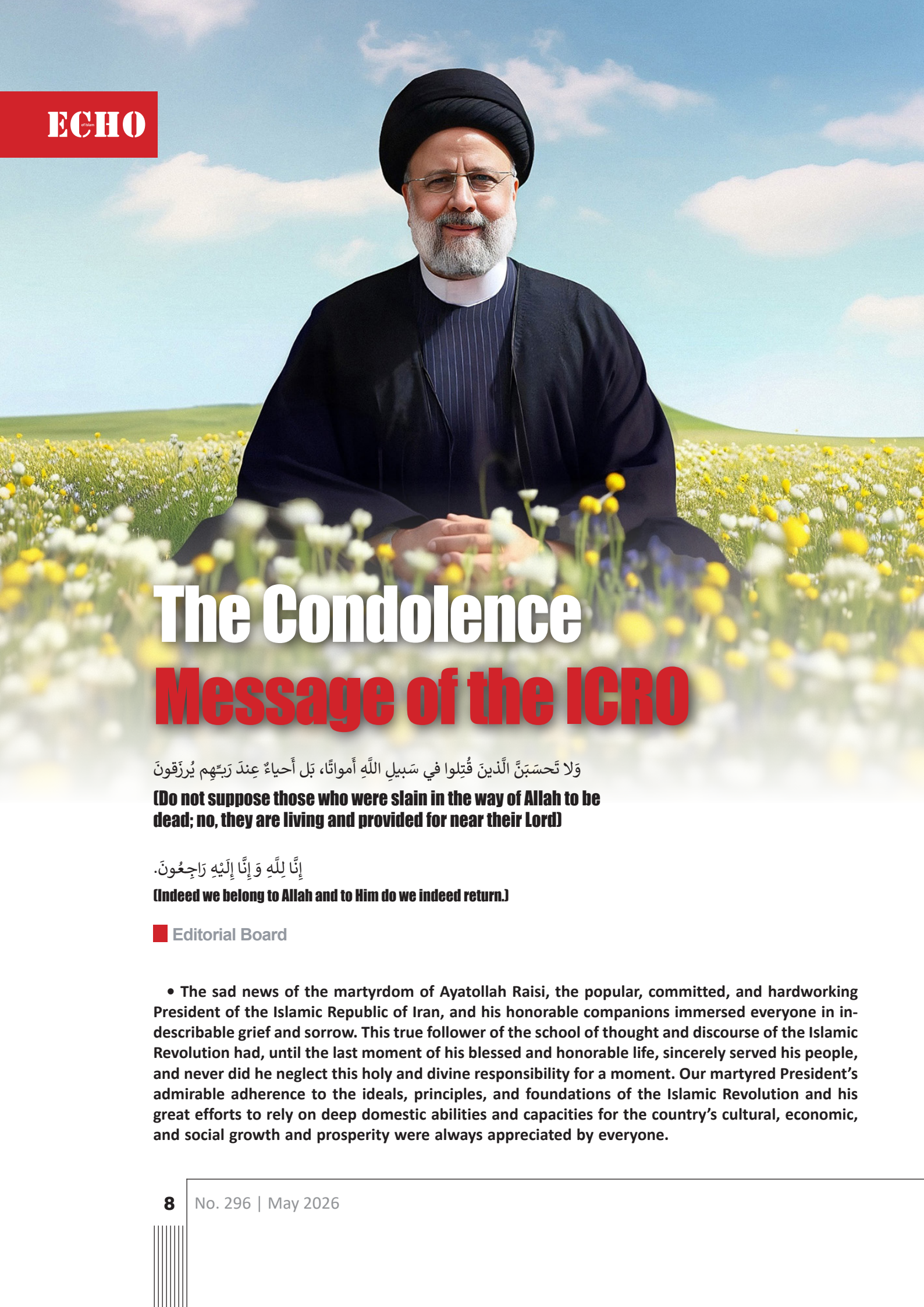

President Raиси Was a Symbol of Religious Democratic Politics

Martyr Ayatollah Raиси was a symbol of religious democratic politics, and his economic policies were aimed at improving people's livelihood, especially favoring the satisfaction of the masses over the satisfaction of the elites.

In his letter to Malik Ashtar, Imam Ali (as) states the economic and political criteria of religious democracy as follows:

“Maintain justice in administration and impose it on your own self and seek the consent of the people, for, the discontent of the masses sterilizes the contentment of the privileged few and the discontent of the few loses itself in the contentment of the many. Remember the privileged few will not rally round you in moments of difficulty: they will try to side-track justice, they will ask for more than what they deserve, and will show no gratitude for favors done to them.”

According to the Commander of the Faithful, prioritizing public satisfaction over the satisfaction of individuals in economic and social policy-making is crucial. During his presidency, Martyr President Raisi demonstrated that his policies were aligned with the public's satisfaction, ultimately sacrificing his life in service of the people. Some of the measures implemented during his brief administration to ensure public satisfaction included the creation of an electronic product catalog plan, providing free healthcare and treatment for the poor and disadvantaged, implementing a plan to make bread and flour subsidies more efficient without directly increasing the price of bread despite various pressures, issuing free business licenses, removing barriers to employment for young people, increasing marriage loans, implementing the Population Excellence Plan, raising subsidies for low-income individuals, and, most importantly, conducting provincial trips and directly addressing people's concerns to resolve their problems.

Paying attention to infrastructure and long-term policies, rather than focusing on short-term benefits, is crucial.

It is important to disregard words of ingratitude, taunts, and sarcasm, and instead prioritize policies that will benefit the people in the long run. This involves prioritizing infrastructural development over policies that only offer short-term benefits but have long-term detrimental effects. Addressing issues such as unregulated money creation by banks and dealing with unhealthy banks to prevent the creation of unregulated liquidity is important. Additionally, increasing economic and trade interactions with neighboring countries and other regions in Asia, Europe, Africa, and even South America is beneficial. Iran's membership in the Shanghai Treaty and the BRICS Group, and expanding economic and trade interactions with China and Russia have helped neutralize financial and trade sanctions and serve the long-term interests of the people.

Martyr Ayatollah Raisi faced numerous challenges during his tenure as president, including a depleted treasury, significant debts, unstable banks, and global crises such as the conflict between Ukraine and Russia, rising grain prices, internal unrest, and conflicts between Gaza and Israel. Despite these obstacles, Martyr Raisi focused on taking action and implementing policies to mitigate the impact of

these crises on the country and its people.

President Raisi's Fight Against Corruption

The Raisi Administration's reliance on meritocracy and the prohibition of relatives from involvement in government affairs are key features in the fight against corruption. As stated in his letter to Malik Ashtar, Imam Ali (AS) emphasized the importance of removing the interference of relatives and friends in government, as it often leads to corruption and the misappropriation of public resources. By following this advice, the government can effectively eliminate corruption at its root.

and functionality of international civil institutions and the extent of their influence on the public opinion.

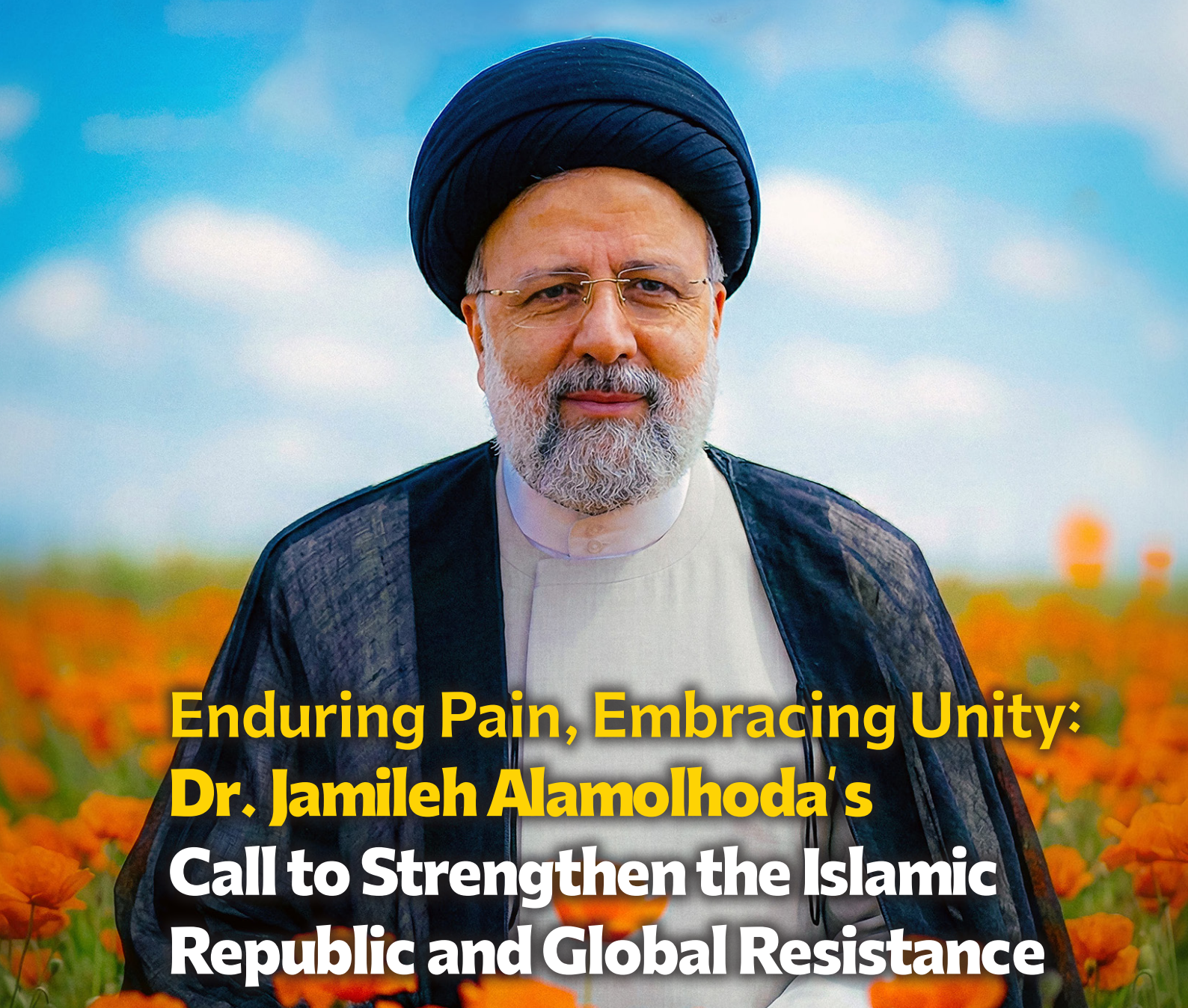

Enduring Pain, Embracing Unity: Dr. Jamileh Alamolhoda's Call to Strengthen the Islamic Republic and Global Resistance

Excerpts from the speech of Dr. Alamolhoda, wife of Martyr President Raisi and a faculty member of Shahid Beheshti University, at the function held in Ferdowsi University of Mashhad to commemorate the martyrdom of Dr. Raisi:

The most painful experience for humans is the pain of separation. We enter this world through separation and force others to endure it when we leave. Iranian literature often depicts the anguish of parting, described by Rumi as the ney (reed) that laments, recounting tales of separation. As humans descend from the realm of angels to enter this world, they ultimately depart and, leaving their loved ones behind, inflict pain upon them. Yet this pain can also be transformative and purifying, presenting an opportunity for a nation's growth. The global community was amazed

by the deep emotions displayed by the Iranian people towards their president and his companions.

The Supreme Leader expressed gratitude to God Almighty, emphasizing that this martyrdom propelled the system several steps forward. He stated that the martyrdom was as significant for the system as the president's life had been. I too am grateful, and I urge all of you to praise the Lord, as what occurred truly constituted a referendum of hearts.

The heroic Iranian nation suffered great sorrow and, in mourning the martyrdom of their president,

created an epic. Despite claims by opponents that Iran's younger generation has strayed from the principles of the Islamic Revolution, this event demonstrated that the people affirmed their support for the Islamic Republic through their tears. This is a remarkable achievement.

One of the late President Raisi's most notable accomplishments was his practical manifestation of the Islamic Republic. For the younger generation, understanding a republic based on Islamic values can be challenging without prominent examples. He also elucidated the meaning of justice, distancing himself from Marxist concepts and showcasing the alignment of culture and science.

As the Holy Quran states: "Do not think of those who are slain in the cause of Allah as dead, but rather, they are alive, flourishing in the presence of their Lord." (3:169)

This revolution will be revitalized by the blood of the martyrs, and we must proudly defend the revolu-

tion and the resistance movement that owes its existence to their sacrifice.

The resistance movement must breathe new life into itself. The upcoming days are crucial for resistance, and we must create an extraordinary feat. I am concerned that people may consider resting after this ceremony, but instead, we should strive even harder. With the honor bestowed upon us, we must support the axis of resistance.

Dear brothers and sisters, Gaza continues to suffer, and the resistance movement stands alone. Visitors from other countries have expressed their worry over losing a key supporter, but I assured them that we have the Supreme Leader and the people of Iran who will stand by the resistance front until the very end.

In the future, I hope for a more groundbreaking era where you will contribute to scientific and cultural endeavors, transforming Iran's movement into a global resistance movement.

We remember Mirza Shirazi¹. Not very well, but when his name is mentioned, our memory lights up. We think of tobacco and its boycott. We think of the dignity Mirza Shirazi earned for Iran.

Avicenna² is our eternal medal of honor. Not just us, but people young and old around the world know him. He held the banner of humanity's salvation and his mind worked to unlock every disease. How many lives were saved and extended because of him, and how many pains were relieved from the people of Iran!

1. Mirza Shirazi: He is remembered for the tobacco boycott and the dignity he brought to Iran. The tobacco boycott is recalled as a significant political and economic action in Iran's history.

2. Avicenna (Ibn Sina): This great Iranian scientist is a medal of honor for all ages. Through his scientific efforts in medicine, he saved many lives and alleviated numerous pains among the people of Iran. His renown extends beyond Iran's borders and he is recognized worldwide.

I won't speak of the Islamic Revolution, the Sacred Defense, and their heroes, as each is recorded in the world's memory. But I will speak of the greatest of them all, Imam Khomeini, who adorned the world with his presence and whose name became eternal. We remember him well, and the young people who grew and thrived beside him, and in the era when he had left with a peaceful heart, they became the leaders of the Islamic system. The memory of the Iranian people is full of endless heroes. Up to today, our last image is of a "people's, competent, and hardworking" president who chained time. He, too, is unforgettable. We will remember the last day of May 2024, the day our mental Guinness book recorded a new record. The tears of thousands of workers, mixed with laughter, as their tables were filled again with bread thanks to the efforts of one man.

I am talking about the man of today's Iranian society. Our dear Raisi.

It was proclaimed that the sanctions were comprehensive and the economic pressure was heavy. The world, plagued by propaganda, believed it. But Raisi said something like this: "Martyr Beheshti responded to nonsense with silence. If we claim to be revolutionary, we must show it in action. Martyr Beheshti was silent, I will also be silent to ensure a good outcome."

When eyes are blinded by ignorance, even the brightest sun is not seen. He was a chivalrous man and accommodating. He showed tolerance to prevent any dignity from being broken and any heart from being troubled by the disputes of the great.

We remember that he said an official of the Islamic Republic does not have something called leisure time in life. He didn't even say "I". He said "an official of the Islamic Republic," and it was this sense of responsibility that made him complete 47 provincial trips in just 33 months.

Raisi was not a prophet. He did not come from the sky but became a symbol of the piety of Generation Z. The way of piety is to enter the world without becoming worldly. The same orphan child who was raised by a mother whose eyes were content with little of this world and whose heart was firm in faith. In his 45 years of management in various positions, pockets, bags, and treasuries were safe from his presence.

We remember that in a world of darkness and oppression, in a rule of corruption and injustice, one can refuse to accept force and be an adversary of oppression. One can stand tall and steadfast in support of the resistance front, and the greatest oppressor in the world will remain silent in the face of his power.

We remember that in these three years, more than seeing his images behind a desk, we saw him among the people of cities and villages. More than being in the capital, he traveled to villages, settlements, and desolate places to see the problems of every corner of Iran and to hear the pains of the weakest

segment of society.

Raisi was good, but one must be more than just good. One must be a manager, responsible, patient, and accommodating. One must have experienced poverty and be compassionate. One must be consultative and supportive, and be with God. One must be great, exceptional. One must be Seyyed Ebrahim Raisi. Our Hajj Qassem said, "One does not become a martyr unless they live a martyr's life, and the way of living like a martyr is to serve the people day and night." One must be more than good; one must be a martyr and a servant.

We remember Mirza Shirazi. Not very well, but when his name is mentioned, our memory lights up. We think of tobacco and its boycott. We think of the dignity Mirza Shirazi earned for Iran.

Seyyed Ebrahim Raisi remains in memories with the honor that sometimes embraced the Holy Quran at the United Nations. With the same image of him praying among the people, a true man of the people, diligent and simple.

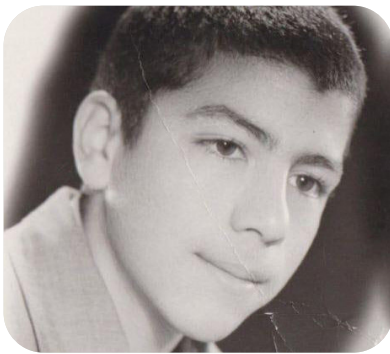
I can't bring myself to say he is gone. I say he remains. In the memories of every child of our Islamic homeland.



A Short Biography

On a chilly autumn night in Mashhad's Noghan neighborhood, Seyyed Haji and Asmat al-Sadat became parents to a baby boy named Ebrahim. Ebrahim was still in his childhood when Seyyed Haji passed away, marking the onset of difficult times for the family.



As Ebrahim grew into adolescence, he followed his father's path by pursuing studies in the seminaries of Mashhad and Qom, advancing to the level of jurisprudence and Islamic legal principles. He later earned a doctoral degree in jurisprudence and private law from Shahid Motahari Higher Education School. Raised in a devout family, Ebrahim began his revolutionary activities in 1977 in response to insults directed at Imam Khomeini by the Ettela'at newspaper, participating in demonstrations and clerical protests.

Following the revolution's victory, Seyyed Ebrahim met Martyr Beheshti and was trained by him to contribute to the formation of the Islamic system's managerial cadre. In 1980, he entered the judicial arena for the first time as the deputy prosecutor of Karaj by decree of Martyr Ghodsi. He was highly motivated and diligent, achieving notable success that led to his simultaneous appointment as the prosecutor of Hamedan.



In 1982, Seyyed Ebrahim married Jamileh Alamolhoda, the eldest daughter of Seyyed Ahmad Alamolhoda, and they had two daughters from this union.

His golden era of judicial and managerial career continued after Imam's demise, and the resolution of many controversial cases was the result of Seyyed Ebrahim's tireless efforts day and night, alongside his colleagues.

In 2021, with over 40 years of executive and managerial judicial experience, he was elected as the 13th President with 18 million votes and ascended to the presidency.

A dedicated scholar and compassionate mujahid, who embodied Islamic ethics single-handedly, endured opponents' mockery and bad manners, was familiar with people's endless suffering, worked tirelessly, and believed that with trust in God, things could be achieved and instilled hope in the people.



However, his wife and their daughters knew from the outset that Ebrahim was a man of the field, so immersed in his work and responsibilities that he spent little time with them. He handled such complex legal cases that his reputation reached Imam Khomeini's office, and with special decrees from the Imam, his responsibilities for solving people's problems multiplied several times over.



On May 20, 2024, to the great astonishment and dismay of the people, news of the helicopter carrying Seyyed Ebrahim and his companions crashing was released, and Raisi, beloved by his martyred companions, joined his martyred supporters and was remembered fondly.



Comprehensive Leadership and Devotion: **The Life and Legacy of Ayatollah Seyyed Ebrahim Raisi**

Ayatollah Seyyed Ebrahim Raisi was born into a clerical family in the Noghan neighbourhood of Mashhad in 1960 AD. Both his father, Hojjat al-Islam Seyyed Haji Rais al-Sadati, and his mother, Seyyedah Esmat Khodadad Hosseini, were descendants of Zayd ibn Ali ibn Al Husain (AS)¹. When Dr. Raisi was 5 years old, he lost his father. He completed his primary education at Javadiyeh School and began his seminary education at Nawab School and then at Ayatollah Mousavinejad School. In 1975, he went to the Qom Seminary and Ayatollah Boroujerdi School to continue his education. For some time, he studied in a school managed by Ayatollah Pasandideh, which functioned under the supervision of Imam

Khomeini (RA). In 2013, he received his Ph.D. degree in jurisprudence and law from Shahid Motahari University.

Regarding his personal life, it is noteworthy that he exalted in knowledge, life, and service to the people simultaneously. In 1983, at the age of 23, Dr. Raisi married Dr. Jamileh Sadat Alam alhoda, the eldest daughter of Ayatollah Seyyed Ahmad Alam alhoda. Dr. Alam Al-Hoda obtained her doctorate in the philosophy of education from Tarbiat Modares University and currently serves as a faculty member at Shahid Beheshti University in Tehran. Ayatollah Raisi and Dr. Jamileh Alam al Hoda embraced a simple and religious lifestyle and are blessed with two daughters.

Dr. Seyyed Ebrahim Raisi, hailed by the Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution of Iran as a comprehensive President, paid special attention to the issue of women and their societal role. He consistently emphasized the education and character development of women, once highlighting the exemplary nature of Hazrat Zahra (SA): "She serves as a role model for Muslim women worldwide, and her way of life should be emulated in all aspects. Consequently, his administration exhibited unwavering support for Iranian women in all spheres, particularly within the academic community. This commitment became increasingly evident through the recruitment of female professors as academic staff at Iranian universities during his brief presidency.

Paying attention to the youth constituted another facet of his comprehensive approach to Iran's Islamic Society. He regarded the youth as the country's greatest source of efficiency, innovation, and creativity, firmly believing that by nurturing their potential, the prosperity of future generations would be substantially secured. Additionally, he espoused the notion that utilizing existing scientific and technical capabilities, as well as available resources, can effectively resolve numerous challenges. The protection of the massive capital and efficient force was one of his concerns. He believed that the youth, who face many harms today, can only be protected through the use of national and religious resources and support, such as the martyrs of the revolution and Ahl al-Bayt. Martyr Hossein Amir-Abdollahian: A True Field Diplomat

In 1976, it all began with a phone call at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. On one end was Martyr Soleimani, and the discussion revolved around Iraq issues. When the expert from the Iraq desk at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs answered the call, he realized that the IRGC Quds Force commander was on the line. This marked the beginning of a friendship between the diplomat of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the field commander.

Iran's Minister of Foreign Affairs, Hossein Amir-Abdollahian, tragically passed away in a helicopter crash along with Martyr President Ayatollah Raisi. The crash occurred in the mountains of Azarbaijan, where the soil was mixed with the blood of this respected diplomat.

Hossein Amir-Abdollahian was born in 1964 in Damghan city. He lost his father when he was 7 years old. He got married at the age of 30. He studied international relations at the University of Tehran and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and earned a doctorate. In his interviews, he emphasized his role as a "diplomat" and often shared interesting stories about General Soleimani or personal meetings with his international counterparts, saying "We diplomats".

He joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs at the beginning of 1991, working as an expert in the Department of Arab and African Countries of the Ministry. According to his own words, if this department had not done him any good, he would have had the privilege of becoming a direct supporter of Martyr Sardar Soleimani. Later, when General Soleimani joined the Quds Corps, he had a close relationship with him. Amir-Abdollahian held such positions such as Deputy Director of the Arab and African Office of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (2011 to 2016), Director General of the Persian Gulf and the Middle East (2010), Iran's Ambassador to Bahrain (2007 to 2010), and

deputy of the special representative of the foreign minister for Iraqi affairs (2013-2014).

He was elected as the Minister of Foreign Affairs in the government of Ayatollah Raisi and took up the "regional balance" strategy. He believed that Iran should have a good relationship with all of them by balancing the relationship between the countries of the region. Also, he did not hesitate to help the resistance groups and was a companion and friend of groups such as Hezbollah, Hashd al-Shaabi, Yemen's Ansarullah, Hamas, and Palestinian Islamic Jihad groups. The proof of this claim was the foreign minister's eight trips to Lebanon and Syria during his ministry. Most of the thinkers of the region and the Arab and African officials had a good relationship with him, and some of Iran's rivals in the region always looked at him with respect. In short, he was known as the "Diplomat of the Field"!

A book about his professional life has been published called "Sobhe Sham". According to Martyr Amir-Abdollahian's testimony, this book was written at the request of General Martyr Soleimani. In a part of this book, interesting narratives of Sardar Soleimani can be seen stating: "Our intelligence departments have many documents that confirm that the main purpose of creating ISIS and the great crisis that was created for the region is the axis of resistance and Iran. The crisis was supposed to be transferred to our country. This was a plan drawn on a macro

level for the region and for us. Each of the countries of the region entered into the story based on their understanding of the issue."

In the field of regional diplomacy, after "Operation Al-Aqsa Storm", as well as the war in Gaza and Israeli crimes in this area, he was always looking for a way to end the crimes in Gaza and help the Palestinian people. He traveled many times to the countries of the region and during his last trip to Gambia, he gave an important speech at the summit of Islamic countries.

He was deeply passionate about "Palestine". All his efforts were dedicated to supporting the freedom of Palestine and the Al-Aqsa Mosque. In addition to his ministerial roles, he also led the Secretariat of the Palestinian Intifada Support Headquarters. This secretariat's primary responsibility was to advocate for Palestinian freedom and emphasize the significance of this issue on the global political stage.

Amir-Abdollahian's regional and international trips to different countries always brought good news. One of his most important activities during his ministry was to restore relations with Saudi Arabia. He also made significant progress in renewing the relationship with Egypt. In terms of the JCPOA and nuclear issues, he successfully navigated nuclear negotiations by following the nuclear strategic law.

Amir-Abdollahian was involved in negotiations for the exchange of prisoners and the return of 6

billion dollars from Iran's blocked money in South Korea. Additionally, he aimed to improve relations with Eastern countries, reduce tensions with regional nations, and foster positive connections with independent countries worldwide. Many of these initiatives were successfully implemented, contributing to a positive legacy for him.

Martyr Amir-Abdollahian's consultations before and after "Operation Wadeh Sadiq" (True Promise) were very prominent in the course of which he created political and diplomatic support for Iran. A clear example of this was his meeting with the UN Security Council in front of the representative of the Zionist regime. In the last 8 months, Hossein Amir-Abdollahian was one of the most productive foreign ministers in the region and the world, who consulted and talked with his counterparts to stop the war in Gaza and implement a ceasefire. He had a difficult time during this period, especially in relation to the Israeli regime's attack on the Iranian consulate in Damascus and Operation True Promise.

In order to enhance foreign policy capabilities and play an effective role in regional and global developments, the Raisi Administration had prioritized the doctrine of neighborhood and convergence. This aims to restore balance to the country's foreign policy. The diplomatic system focused on three main areas: neighbor-oriented policy, balanced foreign policy, and active economic diplomacy. Amir-

Abdollahian had been chosen as the key figure to pursue the goals set for these three areas. One of Amir-Abdollahian's significant achievements was Iran's membership in the Shanghai Pact, which aimed to strengthen ties with eastern countries.
